**Dr. Meredith McClain**

**“Karl May's Imaginary Llano Estacado and its Impact”**



*Dr. Meredith McClain is an associate professor of German at Texas Tech University in Lubbock and director of Tech's Semester Study Abroad Program. After studying music at Oberlin College and Salzburg, Austria, she received her M.A. and Ph.D. in German at the University of Texas at Austin. She also did graduate work at the Freie Universität Berlin. Her areas of research are German Lyric Poetry, the German Short Story, and German-Texan Heritage. In 2002 she was recognized by the German Government for her service in promoting German Studies in the United States. Among her many projects, she served as exhibit curator for the international travelling exhibit "German-Texans and the Llano Estacado Connection."*

*Her keynote address will describe the transatlantic connections between Germany and an area of Northwest Texas by exploring a perspective of the European imagination through Karl May's works, the resulting images from his popular novels, and his continued legacy which all created a particular image of the American West and inspired generations of Germans to move there.*
